Mode of the Month

SSTV, or Slow Scan Television, is a unique mode that is easy to use. You can pick a picture of your choice to send and choose which variation of the mode you want to use, and all you need is a radio, an antenna, and a computer with a program. Some common ones are Scottie 1, Martin 1, Scottie 2, and Scottie DX. A rather uncommon but very quick mode is B/W 8. A nice feature of this mode is that the program used by every operator that I have seen uses the same program, MMSSTV, or its variation, MMSSTV YONIQ. Both programs automatically recognize which variation it is receiving, and, if you choose to respond, switch to that mode when you transmit. You can use any picture, the same one each time, a different one every time, or anything in between! The frequencies commonly used often tend to be in the center of an SSB conversation, so watch out when you switch! Every year the International Space Station transmits pictures through SSTV which is fun as well, and it doesn't take up much of your time because they send the pictures sometimes even at night, so you can just set your computer to receive it. A list of common frequencies can be found here (https://www.amateur-radio-wiki.net/sstv-frequencies/). The download for MMSSTV is <u>here</u> (https://hamsoft.ca/pages/ mmsstv.php) and the YONIQ version here (https://hamsoft.ca/ pages/mmsstv-yonig.php). Beware when you first download the YONIQ version, it was originally made for Spanish so you will have to change the language! Have fun with this mode!!
