Forty-eight years ago on April 3rd at approximately 4:40 in the afternoon an F5 tornado tore through Xenia, Ohio destroying more than 300 homes, killing

32 people, and forcing another 1,300 to seek treatment at Greene Memorial Hospital.

This was part of a Super Outbreak of tornadoes that was the most violent and the second largest on record for a single 24-hour period, leaving more than 300 people dead in its wake.

Ohio, Kentucky, and Indiana were among the worst hit of 13 states and reported 167 deaths. Everywhere you looked trees were uprooted, vehicles overturned, power lines downed, telephone service disrupted, and homes destroyed leaving



hundreds upon hundreds of people homeless and in shock.

The National Weather

Service reported that in all, 148 tornadoes were documented from this event, 95 of which were an F2 or stronger and 30 that were an F4 or F5.
